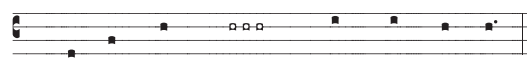
COLLECT OF THE DAY

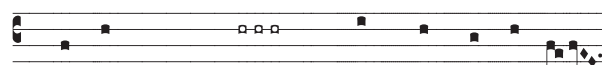
THE LESSON. Ephesians iii, 13-21.

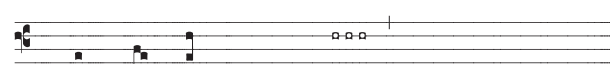
THE HOLY GOSPEL St. Luke vii. 11-16.
